Hot and dry conditions are still presenting some challenges to firefighters during the day, as well as steep and rugged terrain, but crews are making good progress in the fire area. Residents are urged to stay vigilant for any change in fire conditions. Please use extreme caution while driving as fire equipment and crews will continue to work throughout the fire area.
